





#### Participants

19 teachers (14 women and 5 man) at the age of 30-55 years old completed the questionnaire.






#### 1. The curriculum is enriched with cultural heritage themes






#### 2. I often visit with my students festivals or other cultural events




#### 3. I often visit with my students various sites and museums







# 4. The use of new technologies may improve the students' conduct with various aspects of the cultural heritage




#### 5. All the students of the school have equal opportunities to participate in school events




#### 6. The parents of non native speakers participate in school events




### 7. The students of my school often take responsibilities relating to school operation




#### 8. My students work in teams during instruction




#### 9. The school announcements are often translated to other language
